

I live on the Highland Lakes and have been fishing these lakes for over 20 years. Fishing has always been a big part of my life. As a child, I fished every chance that I could. The desire to feel a fish pulling on my line has never dimmed, in fact it grew stronger. While I truly enjoy fishing, I discovered that I also enjoyed taking others' fishing. Putting someone on their first fish, teaching a client a new technique, or just showing a friend a new stretch of water are just a few of the reasons that I started guiding.

SKIFF Program by Bob Maindelle

Dear Friends of S.K.I.F.F.,

Thanks to unseasonably warm weather during Fort Hood schools' Christmas break, I was able to run several SKIFF trips in the closing days of 2021.

Garcia Trip - On Thursday morning, Dec. 23, I fished with siblings Liam and Sophia Garcia on what was the 2021 season's eleventh SKIFF trip. The children's father, Sergeant Manuel Garcia Perelta, is an automated logistics specialist with four years in the U.S. Army. He is currently deployed. The kids' mom, Veronica Munoz, arranged the trip for them after seeing a post about the opening on the Fort Hood Area Events Facebook page.

Using white, 3/8 oz. Bladed Hazy Eye slabs, the kids landed exactly 100 fish, including 1 largemouth bass, 4 juvenile hybrid striped bass, and 95 white bass.

DeLoach/Garrison Trip – During the afternoon of Thursday, Dec. 23, I fished with two young men from different families on what was the 2021 season's twelfth SKIFF trip. Joining me were Robert DeLoach and Ethan Garrison. Ethan's dad, Staff Sergeant Leon Garrison, was recently sent to Fort Benning for a leadership development course. He has served as an infantryman for twelve years. Ethan's mother, Jamie Garrison, coordinated her son's adventure. Robert's dad. Lieutenant Colonel John DeLoach, is currently deployed to eastern Europe with his aviation unit. Robert's mother, Rebecca DeLoach, coordinated the trip after seeing a posting on the Fort Hood Area Events Facebook page.







By working white, 3/8 oz. Bladed Hazy Eye Slabs vertically, and by casting MAL Heavy Lures (white blade, chartreuse tail) horizontally, the boys landed exactly 36 fish, including 1 largemouth bass, 2 juvenile hybrid striped bass, and 33 white bass.

Hinkel Trip – On Christmas Eve, I fished with 10-year-old Ian Hinkel on the 2021 season's 13th and final SKIFF program trip. Ian's aunt Kayla accompanied him, but did not fish.Ian's father, Andrew Weidlich, has been in the U.S. Army for 9 years serving as a Blackhawk helicopter mechanic and is currently separated from his family while serving in Germany.

lan used the white, 3/8 oz. Bladed Hazy Eye Slab in conjunction with Garmin LiveScope to land exactly 52 fish, including 1 largemouth bass, 3 juvenile hybrid striped bass, and 48 white bass.

Fundraising – Mr. Joe Bob Everett of the McBride Foundation let us know the Foundation trustees approved a grant of \$1,000.00 for the SKIFF program on December 8th. Additionally, one of my fishing clients, Mr. Jason Locklin, requested that any donations friends and family might wish to make on the occasion of his father's passing be made to SKIFF. Outlings -Floating the Dechutes River in the Fall by Juan Shappard

I'm thinking ahead. Many people feel the period between mid September and mid October is the best time to fish. Anywhere. End of story. Period. I don't know about your place, but with global warming, mosquitos are still buzzing at my house even in October. What better way than to get out of Texas for a while and treat yourself to a fly fishing trip out west? Not only will you escape the Texas heat, you'll likely see some Fall foliage.

I've secured a guided Deschutes River Float trip in Oregon with 3 nights lodging, meals prepared for you each day, shuttle, and 4 days of guided fishing from 10/9/22 - 10/12/2022 for \$2400. Gratuity and alcohol is not included. BYOB. The Deschutes is Oregon's best known river. It's a desert oasis with wild rainbows, hearty steelhead, whitewater and stunning scenery. I'll be fishing for rainbow (redside) trout primarily in the 15 -20 inch, but I hope to land a steelhead, fresh from the Pacific and running up the Columbia River through the Deschutes and on his way upstream further still to where he was born.



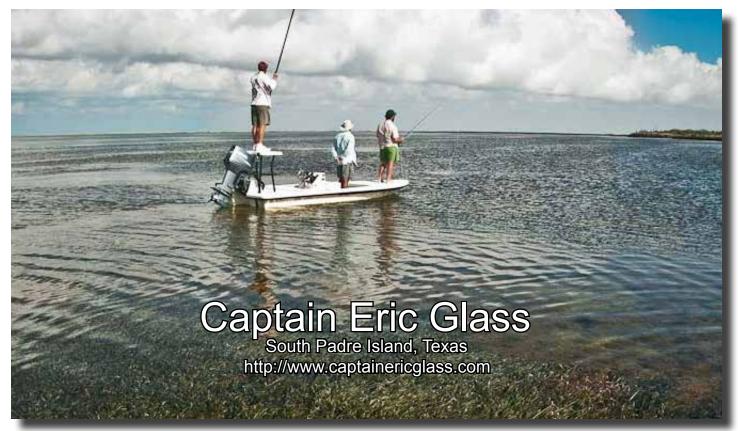
